Graciela Rodriguez is a proud Mexican-American, native of South East Los Angeles. Best known as "Gracie", she's a performing artist who's passionate about community healing and the environment through the performing arts.

She is the current Co-President of the Whittier Sunrise Rotary Club and in 2021-2022 served as Miss Nevada for the United States National Pageant System. An accomplished actress, Graciela recently appeared in Romeo & Juliet Rolling through East LA, a Shakespearean production adapted by Alex Alpharaoh. She also performs in the Coimmedia Dell'Arte traditioin with Mujeres de las Tierras, a grassroots environmental equity non-profit founded in 2004, in the city of Los Angeles. She is currently performing and teaching with the EcoVoices: Speak Up for Water! program of the World Space Foundation, where she teams up with Dr. Shope to

He worked for NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL), where he coordinated science education and public outreach programs nationwide and developed curriculum for various flight projects (Pluto, Mars, Mercury, Venus, Jupiter, Europa, the Sun, the Moon). 
MT. SAC PEACE POLE PROJECT
